Dear Orchestra Families:

Welcome to the start of another school year, one that I believe will reap extraordinary outcomes for students and supporters alike. First and foremost, we have ambitious and enjoyable literature to look forward to, as well as some events that should help invigorate our focus and practice efforts.

On Fri., October 28th through the 30th, the string musicians of the Philharmonic and Symphony Orchestras have been invited to perform with the Saratoga High School Orchestras in the Bay Area. I have known the Saratoga HS music director for many years, and am excited to have our students interact with a "sister" high school program that represents a high level of excellence and class. They in turn are thrilled to host us. Earlier this summer, I received a voicemail from a group of their upperclassmen as they shouted out an excited message of welcome extended to our Mira Costa students. Not only will this exchange concert be a great opportunity for musical synergy and growth, but also, it will allow our string students to develop chemistry and camaraderie (relatively earlier during the school year) that will no doubt enable us to continue excelling throughout the year.

In other news, thanks to the incredible achievements of last year's Symphony Orchestra, this year's members have been invited to audition for a "premiere" status partnership with the LA Philharmonic Youth Orchestra Mentorship Program. Recordings submitted from last year have positioned us to be one of seven finalists for four premiere status spots. The second and final audition round will take place in mid-October, and will involve a panel from the LA Phil observing the full Symphony Orchestra in rehearsal! On top of this, the Symphony Orchestra has also been invited to compete in the ASTA National Orchestra Festival in Atlanta, GA from March 21st through the 24th. This national level competition is comprised of high schools throughout the country who, like us, submitted recordings and other supporting documents that were rigorously assessed by a panel of university professors and professional musicians. Symphony students will not only gain from the input of quality adjudicators and clinicians, but will also benefit from the professional sessions and exhibitions run by the annual ASTA National Convention. Be on the lookout for more details in the coming weeks.

Needless to say, we have much exciting work cut out for us this year. The students will practice hard, and it is my hope that many of you in the Orchestra Booster Club will take a direct part in our fundraising efforts and volunteer work. Together, we will help provide our students with the most educationally rewarding experience possible!
